Iqbal Choudhary, held a high-level virtual meeting with the presidents of all major universities in Gaza to coordinate a collective humanitarian and academic response to the catastrophic impact of the ongoing war on the higher education sector in the region, on July 16.

In a heartfelt message of solidarity, Prof. Choudhary conveyed his deep concern for the plight of the Palestinian people, particularly academics, students, and researchers enduring the relentless devastation. "The suffering of the people of Gaza is unbearable, yet their resilience is inspiring," he said, reaffirming COMSTECH's commitment to supporting Gaza's

academic institutions during this crisis.

During the meeting, the Coordinator General extended a formal invitation to university presidents of Gaza currently outside the region to visit Islamabad. The visit aims to foster direct dialogue with key stakeholders and explore collaborative solutions to sustain academic continuity under these extraor-

dinary circumstances. Highlighting COMSTECH's active support for the Palestinian academic community, Prof. Choudhary shared updates on ongoing programs, including operations through its representative office in Jordan and the provision of 5,000 scholarships and fellowships dedicated to Palestinian students and researchers. → ON PAGE 2





International Workshop to Reimagine Healthcare Leadership Across OIC

A high-level international hybrid workshop titled "Healthcare Leadership: Global Models for Transforming Systems and Culture" was jointly organized by COMSTECH, IiLM, and HealthRAB at COMSTECH Secretariat Islamabad, on July 18. The event brought together senior healthcare leaders, policy experts, and practitioners from OIC Member States to explore innovative models of leadership essential for transforming health systems and cultures across the Muslim world. The workshop was attended by representatives from national health institutions, teaching hospitals, academia, diagnostic laboratories, and allied health organizations from countries: Afghanistan, Egypt, Bangladesh, China, Cameroon, Azerbaijan, Sudan, Uganda, and the United Kingdom, among others.

renowned leadership coach and founder of IiLM, emphasized the urgent need for values-based leadership in healthcare. "This is not merely about management, it is about understanding why leadership matters and how we adapt global frameworks to our local re-


